DEPUTY SHERIFF CADET RECRUITMENT INFORMATION

Note: Each step in the process is dependent on passing the previous step. All candidates will be notified of their standing in the process. **Do not call the Sheriff's Department Background Investigators for your standing in the process. No process information will be given over the telephone.**

TRAINING

The academy training is conducted at Miramar College in San Diego, California. The training program is approximately twenty-five weeks in duration. The course of study includes Patrol Procedures; Criminal Law, Firearms care and use, Defensive Tactics, and other law enforcement related subjects. Upon successful completion of the training program, you will earn 27 ½ units in the Administration of Justice. The Academy is not a live-in academy, generally the hours are Monday-Friday 7:00am-4:00pm.

ASSIGNMENTS

After graduating from the Academy, Sheriff's Cadets are promoted to Deputy Sheriff and are assigned to one of two bureaus: Court Services or Law Enforcement Services.

TEST PROCEDURE

1. **Applications are handed out on a first come first serve basis. It is highly recommended applicants arrive early, and all applicants must check in prior to exam.**
2. **You must bring the following:**
 - **Valid Photo Identification.** You will not be allowed to take the examination without valid photo identification. Valid ID includes most government issued current ID cards, i.e. out of state licenses and military ID cards. Expired ID/Drivers licenses are not allowed.
 - **Black pen and two #2 pencils** to complete application and exam material.
3. The POST Entry Level Law Enforcement Exam is used as the pre-employment exam for both classifications (Deputy Sheriff & Deputy Sheriff Detentions/Courts). Applicants can apply the test results to both classifications.
No aids, such as dictionaries or calculators, are allowed.
4. There is a 2 1/2-hour time limit for this exam.
5. **Applicants are not eligible to repeat the examination under the same recruitment number. Recruitment numbers generally change with the first exam of the new year.**

TEST STUDY MATERIAL:

A link to a practice exam can be found on the Sheriff's Website at <http://www.joinsdsheriff.net> and then click on 'Entry Level Practice Tests'. This practice exam is a version of the actual written exam used for this recruitment. Additionally, the public library, or local bookstores will have books and pamphlets on Entry Level Law-Enforcement examinations. Concentrate on improving your reading comprehension (i.e., reading a paragraph and answering questions based upon what you have previously read), a major factor in the written exam. After taking the written exam, former applicants have expressed that the reading comprehension part was not difficult, yet when these applicants received their score they were disappointed. Take your time. Read each question slowly. Choose the best possible answer. There are no trick questions on the written exam. There is no math on the exam.

PHYSICAL ABILITIES TEST: This will be the Peace Officer Standards Training (P.O.S.T.) Work Sample Test Battery consisting of five (5) separate, timed events: 6 foot solid wall climb, six foot chain link fence climb, 165 pound dummy drag for 32 feet, 99 yard obstacle course, and a 500 yard run. This is a pass/fail test where points are given for each event; most points are earned for completing event in less time. Applicants' total score must be 336 points to pass.

*****The Physical Abilities Test will not be given the same day as the written exam. As you proceed through the hiring process, your Background Investigator will notify you of your date for the Physical Abilities Test.***
